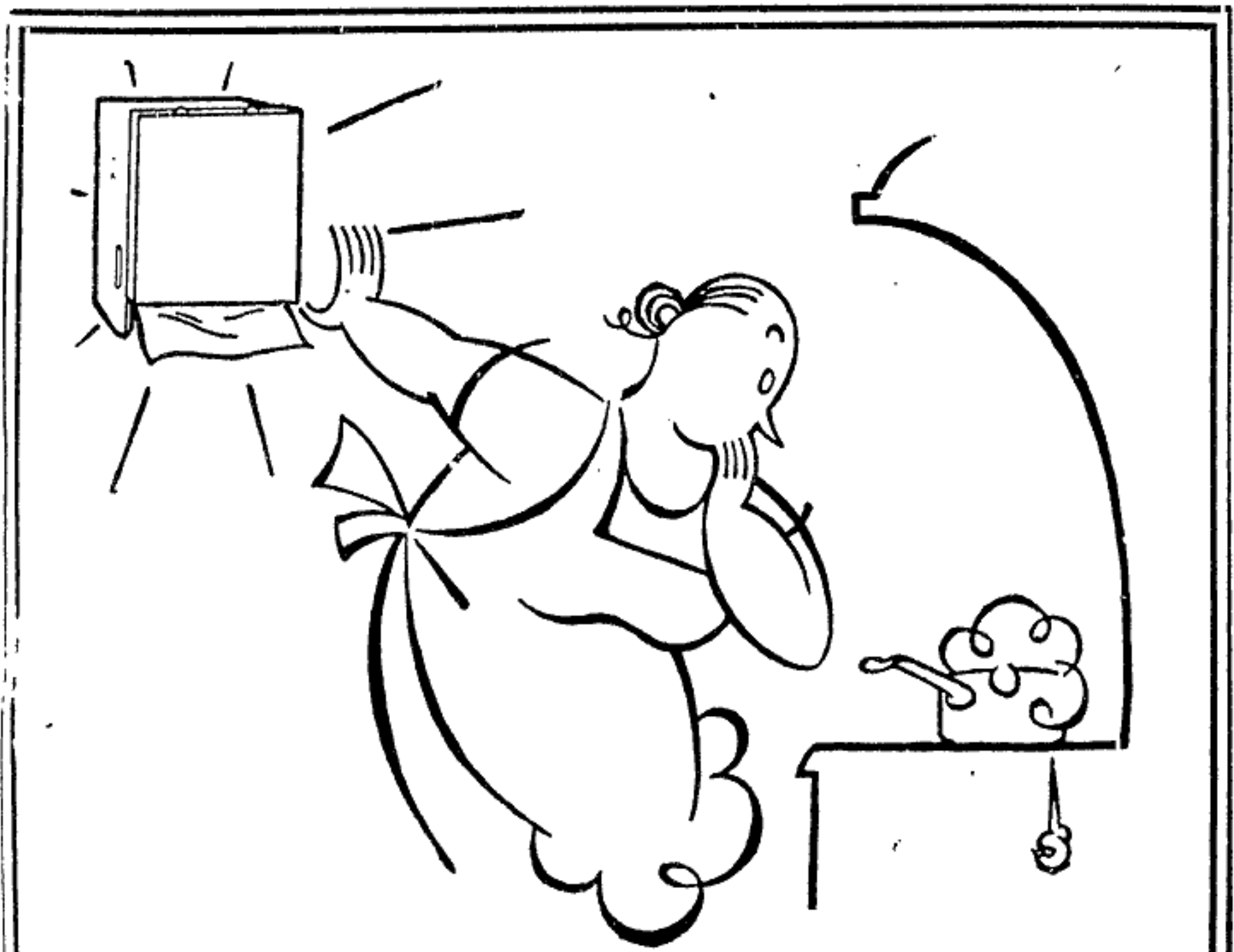

**MILLIONS WILL SEE DARKENING OF SUN**  
 But Not So Many as in 1925 Eclipse

New Haven, Conn., June 16.—Approximately 2,000,000 persons will view the total eclipse of the sun August 31, including about 50 scientists gathered near the little Maine village of Fryburg, according to Dr. Frank Schlesinger, director of the Yale observatory.

Only in 1925, when an estimated 10,000,000 persons saw the sun completely blotted out, has a larger number of persons witnessed the awe-inspiring phenomenon in recent years. The reason for this is that although there is an average of one eclipse a year, the path of totality—that imaginary band across the earth in which the total eclipse of the sun is seen—rarely crosses areas of high population.

**LIQUOR SHIPMENTS UP**  
 Canada Exports 140,000 Gallons More Than in May Last Year  
 Ottawa, June 16.—Exports of whiskey from Canada increased more than 140,000 gallons last month compared with May, 1931, according to reports issued by the department of national revenue. The total exported in May last year was 95,533 gallons and last month the volume had risen to 236,096 gallons. The French possessions of St. Pierre and Miquelon accounted for most of the increase. These islands in May, 1931, took Canadian whiskey to the volume of 33,105 gallons and, last month, 70,556.

If the fugitive escaped into the confines of another township, the chase had to be handed over to the constable of that particular place, who once again set his people in motion.
