Can Halt Pain Without Killing Invalid, Doctor Points Out

CHURCH OBJECTS

The Roman Catholic church is unalterably opposed to letting physicians end the lives of incurable patients, Rev. Dr. J. P. Treacy declared today, commenting on a Berlin report that the Nazi government planned to sanction painless killing of incurables if requested by patient or relatives.

THREE ARE ACCUSED OF 'DOPING' HORSES

Two Caught in Act, Narcotics Agent Says

Detroit, Oct. 10.—The "doping" of horses, which was said to account for several "long shot" winners at the recent race meet here, has led to charges by Joseph Bell, U. S. bureau of narcotics agent, against Robert Wingfield, trainer for the Audley Farm stable, and Thomas Murray and Horace Moore, handlers, of having narcotics illegally.
Bell testified that Moore and Murray were arrested while attempting to dope an Audley Farm filly. When officers surprised them, Moore was holding the horse while Murray stood with a bottle and syringe in hand, said Bell. The bottle was alleged to contain a heroin compound.
