**ANNIVERSARY MARKED
BY TORONTO CHINESE**

Colorful 12-hour Ceremony Sunday Celebrates Founding of Republic

The part of the Orient broadened in the Queen-Elizabeth St. district of downtown Toronto for 12 hours Sunday when the local Chinese

colony celebrated the 25th anniversary of the Chinese republic and the 10th birthday of the Dart Coon club of the Chinese Free Masons of this city.

A four-hour street parade in the afternoon, a five-hour theatre performance in the evening followed by a prolonged banquet far into the early morning hours at 11 Elizabeth St., constituted the great day for Toronto Chinese.

A thousand interested onlookers blocked all traffic as they followed the traditional pantomime parade through the streets of Toronto's Chinatown during the afternoon. Two large "lions," remarkable more for their gorgeous coloring than for

any realism of appearance, headed the procession. One glittering animal represented the Dart Coon club and the other the local branch of the Chinese Free Masons.

Get Rousing Welcome

Appearance of the lions and their followers along the route symbolized the advent of the republic and the nationalist political club which sponsored the demonstration. At every Chinese store, club and office the animals got a rousing welcome. Bunches of lettuce and other greens hung by short cords from second-story windows. The lions clawed themselves up slim poles to devour these offerings. Then 12-foot ropes made of

strands of giant firecrackers were ignited, setting up a terrific din, which was repeated at each threshold of the district. The noise was intended to arouse the spirit of the lions. Judging from the capering and contortions of the beasts, the ear-splitting explosions served their purpose. While the lions danced the offered food and dined frantically as the firecrackers blazed, two Chinese bands on trucks stirred the beats by a crashing crescendo of weird high-pitched eastern music. The excited thrashing of oriental drums, accelerated as the lions pranced. Had 26 Gymnasts Over the white masonic regalia

the 26 gymnasts in the pantomime wore leggings, sashes and head-dresses of flaming crimson, blue and orange. The bizarre, oriental effect was completed by brilliant strips of crystal and steel studding the costumes everywhere and gleaming as the actors cavorted along the street. For the five-hour stage show a legend of China of 2,500 years ago—before the time of Confucius—was chosen. In a gorgeous setting of brilliant silk curtains, hand-worked in gold, red and green by women of the local Chinese colony, the rivalry of the king of Wu and the king of Yet for the hand of beautiful Sai Sei proceeded to its dramatic climax. Sixty actors arrayed in flashing silks of oriental costume portrayed the principal personages of the courts of the warring kings. Dialogue and action moved at a feverish pace during the whole five hours. Through it all wove the thin, shrill, jangling notes of the Chinese orchestra perched on the stage along with the players. In the end the sovereigns of the states of Wu and Yet met in mortal combat, the latter triumphing after a distinctly acrobatic sword encounter. Representatives of Chinese masonic societies of Montreal, Hamilton, Peterboro, London, Sarnia and other places attended the banquet at night, presided over by Paul Wong, president of the Dart Coon club.

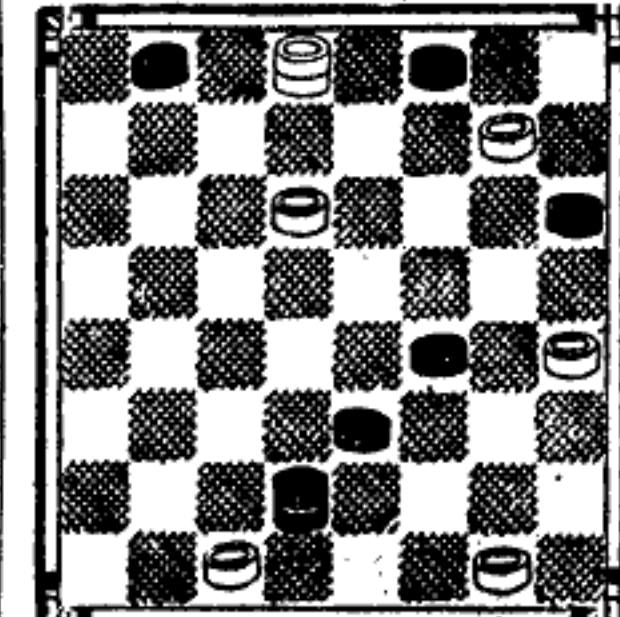
