Wall Making a Tour

Returning from a trip to Prairie points where he found his string of bucking horses in good condition and secured assurances that 25 cowboys will come to Vernon in the hunt for the money prizes at the stampede. "Strawberry Red" Wall, is more than ever positive of success. At Calgary, he interviewed J. Hamilton, an old time Cariboo stage driver, who plans to be here to revive old memories. C. B. McQueen, Alberta Manager for the Great West Life is bringing a party in here for the stampede and there is considerable talk in the old cow town of the valley, its prospects, and the coming event.

Assurances have been received by Manager Wall that Rollie Hayes of Armstrong, Len Rice, Vernon, and other local riders will step out to make the visitors go the limit to win.

Mayor L. L. Stewart and Wall left on Wednesday for a trip as far south as Wenatchee. They plan to get across a lot of information to Americans about the attractions of this country and the doings on June 30th, July 1st and 2nd.

The horse race program is being rounded into shape, and almost a thousand dollars in prize money has been collected. The race card will be almost as attractive as many held in former years when the Vernon races were an annual event.

This afternoon some of the local riders in training for the stampede, are giving an exhibition stampede at F. Hayward's ranch on the Colleston road. There will be steer roping, calf roping, and plenty of thrills when the cowboys ride the string of bronches. It is planned to start at two o'clock.
